Letter From Latvia

Dear Brothers and Sisters in FLMI Family,

We send you our love and greetings from the other side of the world with words from Jesaja 26:3-4 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you. Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord, the Lord himself, is the Rock eternal."

We trust in the Lord and use the opportunities He is giving us. Kandava Soup Kitchen is helping 60-75 people each working day — they are old and sick people, disabled, with poor vision, poor families with many children. May God help Iveta, FLMI, the leader of the Soup Kitchen with wisdom and endurance. This is not an easy job, she

needs to make decisions and be ready sometimes even to receive unreasonable critic regardless what the decisions are. You know — the "wisest" usually are those who do not do anything. But this support - a bowl

of hot soup and bread - is very important for the people in need and they appreciate it.

Talsi Soup Kitchen has not renewed its work as previously before pandemic



when people came together in the church building, but we help these about 20

people by buying gift cards for 15 euros in food shop, visiting them and giving these cards. People appreciate

this help which helps to provide food for each day.

Kaneps family is taking care of the work in the Soup Kitchen. Husband Artis is also a preacher and is very concerned that these people receive also spiritual food. They do not have a place where to gather under the roof. They have only a very old property which is in ruins and is dangerous to come in; during summers they gather outside the old building. Artis shared that he prayed one day asking God what he should do in Sabile; he wants



to give people spiritual

encouragement, to have services with God's Word and worhip, fellowship, but there is no place where to do it. Later he came home and his wife Inguna shared with him that they have received an invitation from local Lutheran churh to use their premises for services. As it turned out, wife talked with Lutheran preacher at the same time Artis asked God about it... It is a strong testimony how important prayers are. They have had already the first service there. With July they plan to have services each Sunday. There is about 35 people coming together and they plan even for baptism in summer - there is a nice river that flows through the town Sabile.

Gita and Janis work with youth that

gather in their home once a week for Christian film evenings. After the film they discussed it and youth had an opportunity to ask actual



questions. They have set up a WhatsApp group for young people

with active correspondence. During this time they offer distance Sunday School materials to children; they need to read, do the tasks and send them in. Gita and Janis are very experienced Christian counselors and has great communication skills. They have started group meetings for mothers once a week with the help of video calls. After this spring when Gita and Janis took part in the Alpha course in Matthew's congregation in Riga as leaders, their group still wants to meet in Zoom and to receive support as the new members in the faith. Together they are looking for answers to various questions. Gita and Janis are leading them on the way to baptism.

Starting from February they visit about 40 families each month bringing

medicines and are thankful to FLMI for support. Despite of limitations they

always find time and opportunities to share with families and pray for them. In spring they gave to several families seeds to plant and grow vegetables and plastic film for greenhouses. Their motto is: Do what you can today and do it without hesitation.

They are gradually restarting also the Open Days in their church in Ciruli village - once a week besides
Sundays people



have the opportunity to come there to receive prayers and encouragement. In summer they plan to organize day camps once a month, meetings for mothers once a month, as well as other activities.

We hope also to have our annual meeting with families of sick children who are supported by FLMI in August.

Our Elita is working on State's Parliament Educational committee and fights against demonstration of pornography and change of gender in media and internet. She asks for prayers since this is a spiritual warfare. Let's support this work!
